




First Week of Advent


Second Week of Advent


Third Week of Advent

Prayer


Lord God, your love for us is endless, your compassion and care know no bounds. Help us to welcome you into our hearts, so that we may live in that love and be at peace always.





ADVENT WREATH

"Customarily the Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles. According to tradition, three of the candles are violet and the fourth is rose. However, four violet or white candles may also be used. The rose candle is lit the third Sunday of Advent, for this color anticipates and symbolizes the Christmas joy announced in the first word of the



Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice" (Latin, Gaude). For this reason the Third Sunday is also called Gaude Sunday, and rose color vestments are permitted. The Advent Wreath represents the long time when people lived in spiritual darkness, waiting for the coming of the Messiah, the light of the world. Each year in Advent people wait once again in darkness for the coming of the Lord, His historical coming in the mystery of Bethlehem, His final coming at the end of time, and His special coming in every moment of grace.
