Today we celebrate Pentecost, the day when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit transformed a group of frightened, confused disciples into a strong, dedicated community—the Church. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, they began boldly preaching the Good News to people of all languages, and making disciples in all nations, as Jesus had instructed.

Gospel Reflection ~ Pentecost

John's Gospel pictures Jesus breathing the gift of his Spirit on the disciples. It is Easter night and they are hiding behind locked doors out of fear of their enemies.



Jesus calms them with his peace. He gives them the power to give peace to others by forgiving their sins. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you," Jesus says.

Mission is a very important word. We sometimes connect this word to working in foreign countries, but that is not all it means. The sisters in some religious communities refer to their places of work as "going on their mission." The Latin ending of the Mass was, "*Ite, missa est*" - "Go, you are sent." *Mission* and *Mass* have the same Latin root of *missa*.



Now we say, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." Loving and serving is what mission is all about; being sent by Jesus. And we each have a mission in life. We are each sent by Jesus to do loving service right where we are.

What do you believe Jesus is sending you to do in this time of your life? How can you keep this sense of mission alive in you each day?

Let us rejoice in the Holy Spirit who guides our lives!

Aiding Your Church ~ The Message of Stewardship

Stewardship is an attitude of the mind and of the heart. When a person makes a specific commitment of their time, their talent, and their treasure to the church, it is because they see our church as their spiritual home. Weekly Contribution Envelopes: You may already be using our parish envelope system. Our 2014 Contribution Envelopes are available for pickup behind the last pew, on the book case in the church. You may also use the brown "visitor" envelopes located in the pews and write your name and address on them to receive credit.

Postdated Cheques: You may wish to donate weekly by postdated cheque. Many of our parishioners who are lucky enough to be "snow birds" for the winter months leave postdated cheques for their weekly offerings. Also, for those who are often away in the summer months, this option provides a means to donate even though you may not be able to attend church regularly.

VISA or MASTERCARD: Convenient, safe, and reliable, contributions can be made monthly or at any time for your convenience. Call the parish office for a form to designate your donations. It's safe, easy, and absolutely free.

Pre-Authorized Donations: Through pre-authorized withdrawals and automatic deposit, you are able to support your parish even when you are not able to be present on Sundays. Your bank account will be debited automatically weekly, monthly or whenever you wish. This amount will be credited to your parish's account. Convenient, easy to budget and no fees!

ALSO - Talk to your tax professional or financial consultant about how you can donate by making the Pro-Cathedral a recipient of **securities** (bonds, mutual funds, etc.); **life insurance, gift annuities, endowment funds, bequests, real estate,** and **gifts of retirement plan accumulations.**

VIGIL CANDLES

Blessed white candles are available ½ hour before and ½ hour after all masses on the weekend and weekdays. You may enter the Sacristy and ask our Sacristan for your vigil candle. It will be lit and at that time you may place your candle on the stand. An offering of \$5 per candle is suggested to help defray costs. The act of lighting your vigil candle is a meaningful prayer offering—a silent way to show our love of God and our desire to express our love for others.
