Our faith community dates back to 1886 when we were originally located on Main Street West and called St. Mary's of the Lake and the cornerstone of the existing Cathedral was laid in 1904. The history of our parish is recorded in the memories of thousands of people who built our community.

GOOD SHEPHERD CORNER

A Way of Experiencing God



- A hands-on, Montessori approach to Christian Formation designed for 3–6 year old children.
- A belief that children already are in relationship with God.
- **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** began in Italy (Rome) over 60 years ago by two Catholic educators: Dr. Sofia Cavalletti (*a Hebrew and Scripture scholar*) and Gianna Gobbi (*a child development expert*) continued the work begun by Maria Montessori, which was to provide a place for children to prepare for their life in the church.
- Children gather in the **Atrium**. A specially prepared environment called after the part of the *church building* where catechumens in the early Church were prepared for participation in the life of the Church. The term was borrowed from Maria Montessori, who had used it to describe an experimental learning environment she had created in Barcelona in 1915 to nourish the liturgical life of Catholic children.
- Through *hands on* encounters children learn the language of God.

Example Activity: (*children receive a presentation on the articles, or tangible items of the mass*)

By introducing articles and their proper names and uses, children feel more connected to the mass. They are gathered around a small model of a bare wooden altar. The catechist deliberately and slowly takes out the items one at a time; state its name, state its use and places the item, with care, in its appropriate place on the altar.

- A white altar cloth
- The paten (*a plate that holds the bread*)
- The Chalice
- A Crucifix
- Two candles



Once all the items are placed, the catechist lights the candles and proclaims, “Jesus died and He is risen.” The children may then work with these materials by setting up the altar. There are also pre-cut paper shapes of each article for the children to paste together an altar model as an art response.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is **open to all North Bay parishioners aged 3 – 6 (Level 1)**

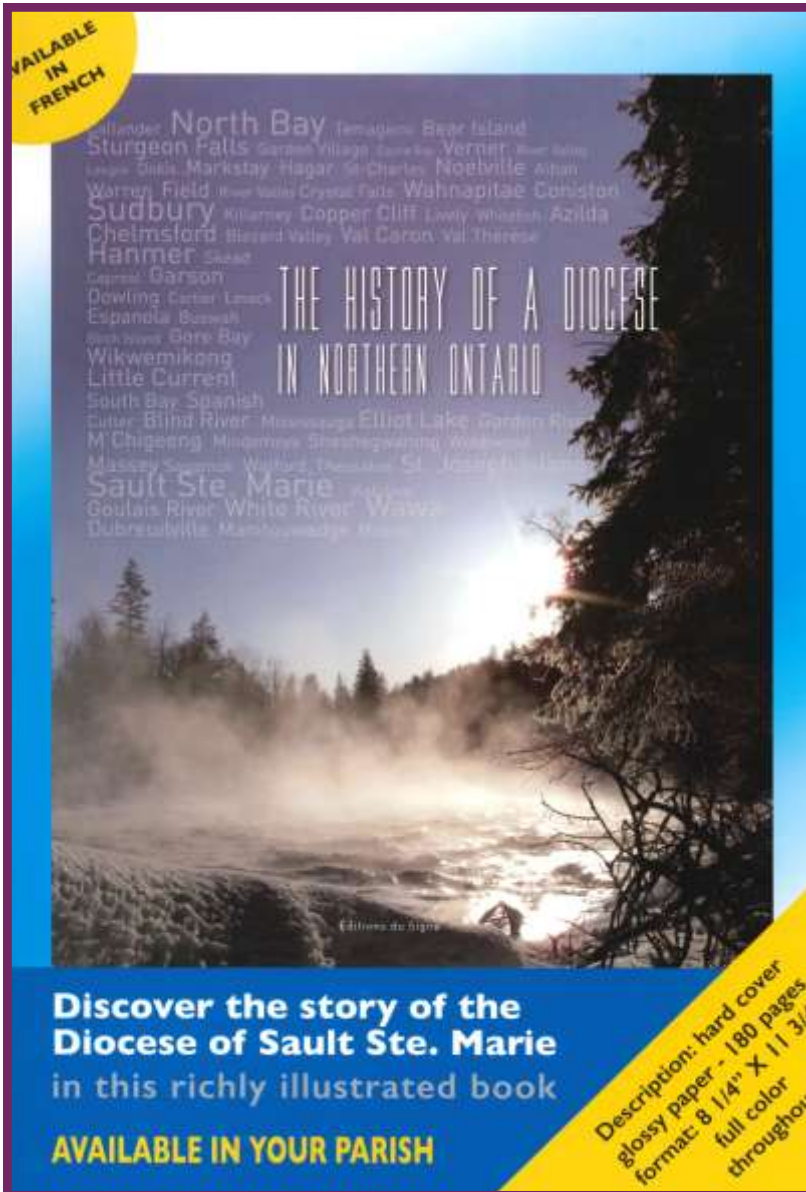
