Reconciliation: Every Saturday from 3:00 until 3:45 PM.



Share Lent Campaign



Lent is the time to prepare for Easter. It is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving for Catholics around the world. It offers the opportunity to think about what it means to create the Kingdom of God and how we can contribute.

This year, Development and Peace invites you and your family to reflect

on how we can **Create a Climate of Change** in our personal lives in order to show greater care for our planet. Some things we do, like waste food, pollute, or throw a lot in the garbage, harm the environment in a way that contributes to climate change.

In 2016, Lent falls within Pope Francis' Jubilee Year of Mercy (Misericordiae Vultus), in which he calls us to be merciful in order to make true connections with others. Let us reflect over the Lenten season on how we are all connected to each other, and to use this reflection to commit to helping our sisters and brothers around the world!

Right now, our sisters and brothers in the Global South are experiencing droughts and terrible storms because of climate change. But if we all do our part and make changes in how we live, we can reduce our harmful impact on the environment, which will help our sisters and brothers in the Global South!

Thanks to your donations, Development and Peace supports communities and families in Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East who must courageously live through drought, typhoons, floods and other destructive impacts of climate change.

VATICAN - PASTORAL CARE WORKERS KILLED IN 2015

Vatican City (Agenzia Fides) - The wake of pastoral workers killed in this historic phase of humanity reveals an unprecedented upsurge. It seems to have no equal in history, because it is an ongoing globalized persecution. America, already for seven consecutive years has the sad primacy with eight pastoral workers killed. Followed by Asia with seven, Africa with five and finally Europe with two priests in Spain.

These numbers are just the tip of the iceberg of global persecution of Christians. Isis, Boko Haram, discrimination in various countries where religion is an affair of State, make being a Christian difficult and heroic, subject to attacks and massacres.

During 2015, 22 pastoral care workers were killed worldwide, three more compared to 2013. From 2000 to 2015, 396 pastoral workers, including 5 Bishops were killed worldwide.

The pastoral care workers who died violently in 2015 are: 13 priests, 4 religious sisters, 5 lay people. In America: 8 pastoral care workers were killed (7 priests, one religious sister); in Africa 5 pastoral care workers were killed (3 priests, 1 religious sister); in Asia 7 pastoral care workers were killed (1 priest, 2 religious sisters, 4 lay people); in Europe two priests were killed.

There is still much concern regarding the fate of other pastoral care workers kidnapped or have disappeared, of whom we have not had any news.

Many Christians, in every corner of the world, continue to suffer and even pay with their lives for their faith in Christ.
