## Welcome to Your Father's House!



Moses speaks to the people and has them consider all the ways God has cared for them and revealed himself to them. That is why they must keep his statutes and commandments. Paul tells the Romans that all *who are led by the Spirit of God* are children of God and heirs with Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the eleven disciples to go *and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* Today's readings talk about our relationship with God: that he

has revealed himself to us, provided for us, taught us, disciplined us, and given us the way to eternal life. We are led by the Spirit, and commissioned to carry the Good News to all the world.

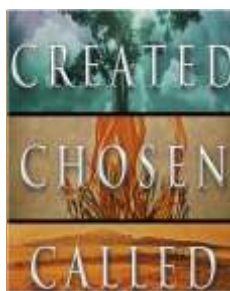

**Trinity Sunday**



Moses' words attest to the wonders of God and his continual care and "championing" for us. This all-powerful God chose us to be his own; he created us in love and desires for us to be with him forever. He loves us enough to have become one of us – to live and breathe and suffer as one of us! While on earth as Jesus Christ, he showed us, in healing and forgiving, the depth of his merciful and unconditional love. Through the Son we are made adopted children of God, co-heirs with Christ to the promises of the Kingdom. The Holy Spirit is sent to remain with us – always – demonstrating the steadfastness and faithfulness of God to his people and drawing others to the Father's love. And we, members of the Body of Christ, are commissioned to go "and make disciples of all nations," that all may be given the pathway to the Kingdom.

"When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted." After all the Apostles had witnessed, even after their encounters with Jesus following his resurrection, they doubted. That is, until Jesus reassured them that "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me." Then, look out! Once empowered by the Spirit, the disciples no longer doubt. In readings from the Acts of the Apostles throughout the Easter season, we have heard how the Apostles are transformed into bold and relentless preachers and leaders, healers and miracle workers, by their belief in the power of the Holy Spirit. And they can't suppress the joy they know in believing the Good News. We were made for this joy, and for sharing it as the earliest disciples did. Given all that God has done for us, how can we not?

Read Scripture verses or hymns that rejoice in God's love and bring you joy. (Phil 4:4-9 is a good start). Pray the Act of Faith to reaffirm your belief in the Trinity. Be a joyful Christian!

**Act of Faith**

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man, and died for our sins and that He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them, who can neither deceive or be deceived. Amen

VATICAN CITY (CNS) — Prayer is not a magic wand or a way to ask God to be at one’s service, Pope Francis said. Prayer is a humble dialogue with God to grow spiritually and discover his will for the world, the pope said May 26 during his weekly general audience.

“In prayer, it is God who must convert us, not we who must convert God,” he said. “Sometimes our prayers seem to go unheard, what we have asked for — for ourselves or for others — is not fulfilled,” he said. “Why does he not respond to our requests?” the pope asked. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (2735) asks people to think more deeply about why they demand to see the results of their petitions: “What is the image of God that motivates our prayer: an instrument to be used? or the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ?” it says.

“Prayer is not a magic wand,” he said. “It is a dialogue with the Lord. When we pray, we can give in to the risk of not being the ones to serve God, but of expecting him to serve us.” “When we pray, we need to be humble” and believe “that God will give me what is right to give. People sometimes pray for the wrong reasons, keen to make sure God is with them”, he said, “but few bother to check whether they are actually with God.”

What about when the prayer request is worthy and charitable, like for the end of a war that does not cease, or “when people pray with a sincere heart, when they ask for things that correspond to the Kingdom of God,” like when a mother prays for her sick child, the pope said. “Why does it sometimes seem that God does not listen?”

Looking at the Gospels, Jesus heals many people, either responding to their pleas immediately or much later, the pope said. Over time, people may see that some things do work out, “but in God’s way, the divine way, not according to what we wanted at that moment. God’s time is not our time,” he said. “Let us learn this humble patience, to await the Lord’s grace, to await the final day,” when God solves everything, he said. “Jesus said faith moves mountains, and Jesus “feels special tenderness before that faith and he listens.”
