

Welcome to Your Father's House!



In the first reading, the prophet Ezekiel is sent by God to the rebellious house of Israel. In the second reading, Paul explains to the Corinthians that he had asked for an affliction of his to be removed, but the Lord had said to him, *My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness*. In the Gospel, Jesus faces opposition in his native place and is amazed by the people's lack of faith. We are a world full of social division and unrest – not unlike the rebellious house of Israel in the first reading. But God never abandons us: He sends prophets; he also chooses the seemingly most unlikely of people, such as Paul, to proclaim the Good News. And in our own faults and weaknesses, he has the power to work through us if we but direct our efforts toward Christ and allow his grace to transform us.

- * Anyone who is in an at-risk health group or does not feel comfortable attending a public gathering should stay home. Even with the best health practices and increased efforts to clean the Church, there is a risk of infection anytime a person enters a public space.
- * Anyone who is sick or has recently been exposed to the coronavirus should refrain from attending a public mass as it is an act of charity to safeguard the health of others.
- * Attendance at mass is still restricted to ensure proper social distancing.
- * We are mandated to wear masks by the Ontario Medical Office of Health and the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario. We ask that you **please bring and wear your mask before entering the Cathedral.**
- * Follow all directions from our ushers so social distancing can be maintained.

"That is why," says Paul, "I am content with my weaknesses, and with insults, hardships, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong." That is the voice of a true prophet.



Strengthening Faith

Practical application: Shipbuilding our faith

- We have seen from the *Catechism* that we can guard our faith and help it grow by constant prayerful reading of the Sacred Scriptures; by asking God to increase our faith; by doing good for others; by making acts of hope rather than giving into sadness; and by holding to all the doctrines of faith and morals that the Church teaches. Also, our weakness need not be any obstacle to faith but can increase it. Thus, we have a menu of ways we can grow in faith. If we ask the Holy Spirit for light, he will show us what would be best to focus on.
- *Prayerful reading of the Sacred Scriptures.* Our Lady heard the Word of God and kept it. Martha's sister Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and listened and received the better part. Try to find five minutes a day to read the Bible.
- *Asking God to increase our faith.* "Increase my faith" is a perfect prayer in God's eyes. He is pleased when we do so.
- *Doing good for others.* The virtue of faith is united to the virtue of charity. We show we believe in God whom we cannot see by loving the persons around us whom we can see. All of us have many opportunities every day to serve others and make them happier, whether it is in our family life, school life, friendships, or in the world of work.
- *Making acts of hope.* Sometimes we are tempted to give into sadness and to enjoy feeling sorry for ourselves. This is just a sneaky way to make us self-centered. A very simple act of hope is the petition from the Lord's Prayer, "Deliver us from evil."
- *Being full-menu Catholics.* Rather than being "cafeteria Catholics," picking and choosing what doctrines of faith or morals we will accept and reject, we embrace all the doctrines of faith and morals that the Church teaches. This requires a serious effort to study the faith, particularly the areas we find more challenging.
- When it comes to the teachings of the Church, which are Christ's teachings, we want to be those who "heed" not "resist."
- *Embracing weakness.* Our weakness need not be any obstacle to faith but can increase it. Thus, a temptation to sadness, an impulse to be selfish, a desire contrary to the moral law, being rejected by another person—these are all opportunities to be humble and to let God's grace go to work.
- In these moments, we learn "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" and "in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his Body, that is, the Church."

Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

The prophet Ezekiel is told that those to whom he will be sent are "hard of face and obstinate of heart"; and Saint Paul aptly describes a "thorn in the flesh" as having been given to him. He even refers to this thorn as "an angel of Satan." These are descriptive images! What do these images look like in practice? The Gospel gives us a clear example: those who grew up with Jesus refuse to see him as a prophet.

As we grow older, we become aware of not only more physical aches and pains, but the "thorn in the flesh" of patterns we are not particularly proud of – cynicism, pessimism, even hard-heartedness and a closed mind. The "they" in today's readings hits closer to home and strikes us more as "we" than it used to. And yet, as Saint Paul reminds us, we can bring our imperfections to God and pray for grace to give us strength in our weakness, hearts open to God's love, and ears ready to hear the Gospel and be transformed by Jesus.

When Jesus returned to his hometown, he was not exactly greeted like a "hometown hero." His contemporaries could see him only as a carpenter, and not the Messiah: "So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith." We know that Jesus went on to perform the mightiest of deeds – dying and rising from the dead. And yet, even today, he would be "amazed at our lack of faith."

Today's Gospel and the other readings encourage us to do a check-up of our spiritual health and pray for the grace to continue to grow in faith. We can also pray for others who may be questioning or have lost their faith, inviting them to consider coming to church with us or simply offering to pray with and for them.
