The first reading teaches that in order to be forgiven, one must forgive. In the second reading, Paul teaches that none of us lives and dies for oneself, but together for the Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the debtor who refuses to share with others the mercy he has been shown by his master. We are all the same flesh: fellow sinners, servants, and debtors, and God's mercy is for us all. We cannot seek pardon for ourselves yet refuse mercy to others. We must forgive as we have been forgiven. In the community of God's covenant, mercy is shared, not seven times but seventy-seven times, as Jesus teaches.

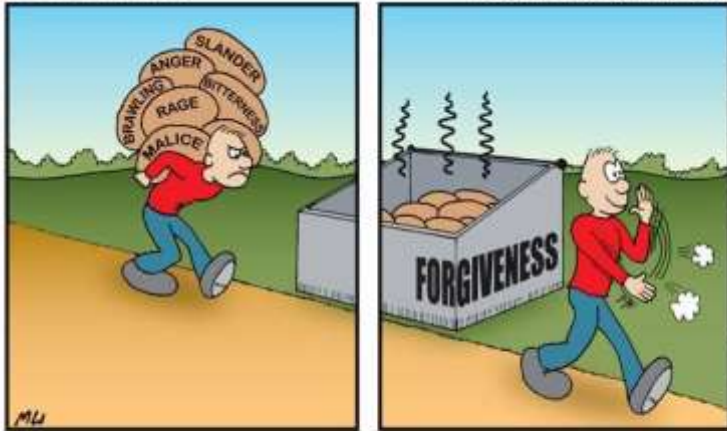

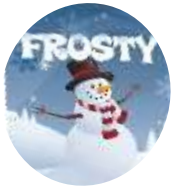
REGISTER BEFORE SEPTEMBER 27 ~ CONFIRMATION PREPARATION

If your child is missing these sacraments and wishes to be confirmed—contact the parish office as soon as possible.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium and the Prepared Environment

The prepared environment is a Montessori concept that the environment can be designed to facilitate independent learning by the child. In a prepared environment, children work with materials of their own choice and at their own pace. They experience a combination of freedom and self-discipline in a place especially prepared to meet their developmental and spiritual needs.



Catechist Suzanne is reading the parable passage as the children move the wooden pieces.

The catechist prepares the materials for the children then introduces the material by modeling how they are used. After a material has been introduced children have the freedom to work with it. The Atrium is full of materials that reflect the life of Jesus and the life of the Church. The Atrium is a prepared environment, created specifically to meet the spiritual needs of children 3 to 12 years of age. Visit the atrium in the hall when you need to take a stroll downstairs at the Pro-Cathedral.
