Isaiah prophesies of the servant of the Lord who has not turned his back on the Lord but has given his back to those who beat him, believing that the Lord is his help. In the second reading, James argues that faith without works is dead. In the Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples who they say he is. Peter answers, *You are the Christ*. Jesus then says that anyone who wishes to follow him must take up his cross. Today we hear the question that is at the center of the entire Gospel. Who is Jesus, and what does it mean to follow him? We would do well to reflect on this question from time to time. Who do we say that Jesus is, and how do our actions demonstrate this belief?

The Good Samaritan Corner

Recently, the Compassionate Committee for the Homeless in North Bay wrote a letter to the various levels of government asking them to implement some of the recommended action of the "Solve the Crisis" campaign, a comprehensive plan to assist municipalities in addressing the challenging situation of supporting people experiencing homelessness.



Lack of supportive affordable housing is a crisis in the Nipissing District. The Nipissing District Poverty Report: Housing and Homelessness indicates that Ontario Works recipients experiencing homelessness rose from 4% in 2021 to 7% in 2022. Social service groups in our community indicate that there are not adequate resources and appropriate housing available to provide support.

Of the recommendations made in the "Solve the Crisis" project, we urge the governments to: a) Provide our municipality with the resources to have a 24/7 community hub to relieve pressure on emergency departments and first responders; and b) Commit to increased funding for supportive, affordable housing so that people can transition from homelessness to appropriate housing with the necessary supports.

In addition to the recommendations in the "Solve the Crisis" project the provincial government needs to support Bill S-233, a Federal Act to develop a national framework for a guaranteed livable basic income. This will support people to get out of the cycle of poverty, to provide food security and to prevent homelessness.

There are many committed individuals and organizations in the Nipissing District who are working to end homelessness. We are counting on our mayor and our members of parliament to support aspects of the "Solve the Crisis" campaign and to advocate for increased provincial and federal resources so that everyone will have a place they can call home.
