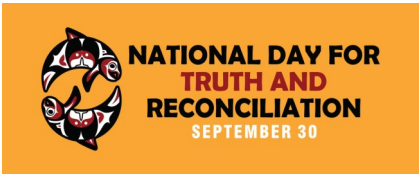

September 30 — National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Come take action by joining us in Truth & Reconciliation for the Non-Indigenous: A Spiritual Exercise for Personal Discovery. If you have ever felt a loss in understanding the meaning of this day; If you struggle with the Christian Churches' along with the government's involvement with the history of the Indigenous peoples; If you feel compelled to DO SOMETHING positive on this National Day for Truth and Reconciliation but don't know what you can do, then gather with us in prayer, reflection and meditation.



Join us in one of two locations: Anishinabe Spiritual Centre (Espanola) – Meditation @ 9:30am with Sunrise Ceremony in Teepee 7am. Elder available all day 10-hour Adoration at the Centre from 8am-6pm (drop-in) or at Villa Loyola (Sudbury) – Meditation @ 2pm; Adoration Noon-4pm . You can also take the opportunity to pray on this day, a special prayer by Joseph Chiwatenhwa, first lay administrator in the Catholic Church in Canada in 1639.

Prayer by Joseph Chiwatenhwa (in part)

O God, at last I start to understand you. You made the earth, which we live in. You made the sky, which we see above us. You made us, we who are called people. Now you let me start to know who you really are. I know how to make a canoe, and how to enjoy it. I know how to build a cabin and how to live in it. But you, you made us, and you live in us. The things we make last for a few seasons. We only use the canoes we create for a short time. We only live in the houses we build for a few years. But your love for us will endure so long that we cannot count the time. You will comfort us forever. As long as we live, how can anyone not acknowledge you? You are the one who protects us. The time we feel your presence the most is when we face death. You are the one with the power to keep our souls alive, because only you know how to love us in the deepest part of ourselves. Not even a mother or father can love a human being the way you do. Your love for us is so strong that it makes evil spirits lose their power. Now I begin to see that the reason you made us is because you want to share your love. Nothing attracts you as much as your people. Thank you for letting me understand you. You love us so deeply that all I can do in return is offer myself to you. I claim you as my elder and chief. There is no one else. Ask me for anything you want. Just let me always hold you in my heart. I always want to feel you watching and protecting me.

*Joseph Chiwatenhwa helped the Jesuits translate hymns and prayers from French into Huron. He was impressed with the teachings of Saint Ignatius and the **Spiritual Exercises**. During his eight-day silent retreat, he composed a prayer that reveals his profound experience with Jesus: “**You love us so deeply that all I can do in return is to offer myself to you. I chose you as my elder and chief. There is no one else.**” In adopting his new faith, Joseph drew on many of the spiritual and cultural teachings of his people; he entered the Catholic Church as a Huron. This helped him spread the Good News to many members of his family and tribe.*

You are Invited to Participate in a Fall Webinar Series



The Jubilee of 2025 “Pilgrims in Hope” is a jubilee that will be celebrated in the year 2025. The forthcoming Jubilee will take place in line with the norm of leaving a 25-year gap between each one.

The most recent ordinary jubilee took place in the year 2000, as the world and the Catholic Church prepared to enter the new millennium. At the close of the Jubilee in 2000, Pope John Paul II spoke to the children of the world, noting that the children and young people of that time would be "the leading players at the next Jubilee in 2025.

The Jubilee Year is a special year of grace, in which the Church offers the faithful the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence. Traditionally, it begins just before Christmas and ends on the Epiphany of the following year.

The Pope inaugurates the Holy Year with the rite of the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. After that, the Holy Doors of the other papal basilicas – St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major – are opened and remain so until the end of the Jubilee Year.
