Welcome to Your Father's House!



Elijah goes to Zarephath, where he asks a widow for water and bread. She brings him the water but tells him she does not have much left for bread. He tells her to not be afraid and that her supply will not go empty. In the second reading, the author writes that Christ *appeared before God on our behalf*. In the Gospel, Jesus observes a widow contribute to the treasury and teaches his disciples that her gift is worth far more than the gifts of the rich. Our readings today feature two widows who teach us about faithfulness. To have faith is not just to hold our breath and aimlessly wish for good outcomes. Rather, God calls us to a faith that is endless trust in him, knowing in our deepest heart that God loves and cares for us beyond measure.



You can change your default support option online at the Municipal Property Assessment Office website or you may also call MPAC at 1-866-296-6722 to complete the school support changes for electoral purposes or to add a name(s) to an existing address.
