FIRST GATHERING coming up January 26

The celebration of First Reconciliation will be held March 26, 2025 and First Communion will be held on June 1, 2025.

Please pre-register your child now and correspondence will be sent to you at a later date regarding preparation gatherings. The on-line registration form can be found on our website under **SACRAMENTS** under both Eucharist and Reconciliation. The forms have the option to register for one or both of the sacraments and once completed, they can be emailed to: office@procathedral.ca

Children who have already celebrated Baptism are welcome to register. To register for First Communion, children should be baptized and have already celebrated First Confession.

As with all of our sacraments for children, the preparation process takes place “in the midst of the community” especially when it gathers at the Sunday assembly throughout the year. 

The Good Samaritan Corner

Winter weather is upon us! People experiencing homelessness are desperate no matter the season, however, cold temperatures can be especially difficult, contributing to hyperthermia and frostbite. Here is what you can do if you see someone experiencing homelessness in the cold:



- 1) Save a life – call 9-1-1
- 2) Buy them something hot to eat or drink
- 3) Make a handout care package – fruit, oatmeal packets, granola bars, pre-packaged cookies, pre-packaged cheese and crackers, packaged chocolates, warm socks and gloves, gift cards to a local grocery store, lip balm, a handwritten note with a message of kindness
- 4) Donate to a charity that supports people experiencing homelessness including local churches.
