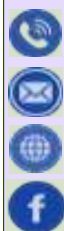

The celebration of First Reconciliation will be held March 26, 2025 and First Communion will be held on June 1, 2025.

Please pre-register your child now and correspondence will be sent to you at a later date regarding preparation gatherings.
