The Compassionate Committee for the Homeless in North Bay recognize that the homeless have urgent needs.



What do you do if you come across a person you are concerned about? If they are in medical distress – call 9-1-1. If they do not require medical attention and you are willing to interact with them, ask them what they require. They may need warm clothes, a hot meal, a ride to somewhere warm or a place to sleep.

There are eight churches from different Christian faiths that are part of the Compassionate Committee for the Homeless in North Bay and each church has a copy of the **Quick Reference Guide** with useful information on the resources available to provide help to the homeless.
