



Welcome to Your Father's House!



Isaiah sees the Lord seated on a throne and declares himself a *man of unclean lips*. Paul reminds the Corinthians of the gospel he preached to them that Christ died for our sins and rose again. In the Gospel, after following Jesus' instructions leads to an abundant catch of fish, Peter declares himself a sinner. Peter, James, and John leave everything to follow Jesus. Both Isaiah and Simon Peter stand in awe of the power of the Lord. Isaiah declares his lips unclean and Peter calls himself a sinful man. They recognize their own lowliness in the face of the Lord's majesty. Paul reminds us that Christ died for our sins and was raised. When we confess our sinfulness, we also acknowledge God's power to forgive us.




