Welcome to Your Father's House!

A tree is always known by its fruits. Many use the excuse that God looks at the heart to justify a worldly lifestyle. They forget that the fruits of their lives reveal the condition of their hearts. A bad tree bears bad fruits, and a good tree bears good fruits. Be holy inside out.

Today's first reading warns of the power of speech to reveal one's faults. In the second reading, Paul explains that Jesus has defeated sin, the cause of death. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to stop judging others, and says that *every tree is known by its own fruit*. In the second reading we heard that death is no longer something to be feared, for it has been *swallowed up* by the victory of Christ: *Where, O death, is your sting?* Jesus' life, death, and resurrection have transformed death into the road to eternal life. Therefore, in this life, we must labor with the steadfast hope of attaining heaven, certain that if we strive to serve the Lord our work is not in vain.

Thank you to everyone who attended and for your generosity. With your good-will offerings we raised \$1,110.70 for the Roof Campaign!



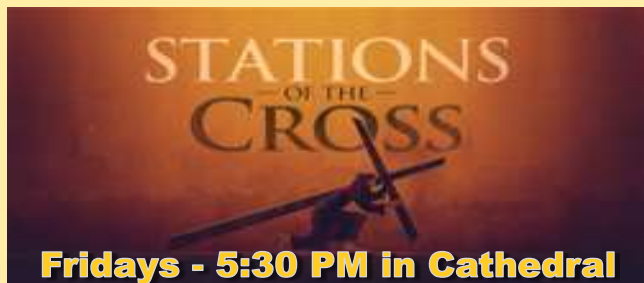
**Lent Begins
on Ash Wednesday
05 March 2025**

**Celebrations
12:05 PM & 5:30 PM**

The ashes on our forehead are our public witness that we acknowledge our failure and sins. We admit our human weakness and plead for Christ's help, because we are powerless without Him.

The sign of the cross on our foreheads is a reminder of the other times of our Christian lives that we have been signed with cross and holy oil: the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick.

On Ash Wednesday this cross upon our forehead is different. There is no sacrament, no holy oils. We are signed with dust, a reminder of our death and decay. The ashes remind us of our sins. And yet, that cross of ashes is not doom and gloom. The cross gives us hope, reminding us that our source of grace is Christ crucified. He conquers sin and death. *By receiving that cross of ashes, we are making the first step to return to Christ and walk with Him on this Lenten journey, because without Him we are and can do nothing!*



Lent & Fasting & Abstinence

We may give up meat or other desirable foods on Fridays during Lent, and especially on Good Friday, the day of Christ's saving death on the cross.

Our abstinence for Catholics 14 years and older (as long as there are no health issues) is another way of sharing in Christ's work of saving the world. We may also substitute other good actions for abstinence. These could include special acts of charity (visiting the sick or aged, helping those in any need, contributing to a work of charity) or other acts of piety (taking part in a service of worship with others, praying with our family, spending some extra time in personal prayer, especially with the scriptures).

GOOD SAMARITAN CORNER

Addressing the needs of people experiencing homelessness doesn't just mean providing food, essential items, and warm footwear. It also includes advocacy and education.

Did you know that eight people in North Bay are homeless Veterans? One homeless Veteran is too many! Operation Leave the Streets Behind, is a program run by the Royal Canadian Legion and funded by the Poppy Fund. It was established to prevent and eradicate Veteran homelessness in Canada. The fund provides financial assistance for items such as first and last month's rent, rental arrears, and furnishings. The fund started in 2010-2011 and since then, in North Bay, they have accessed \$86,000 to support Veterans who are near-homeless or experiencing homelessness.
