Welcome to Your Father's House!

In the first reading, Moses explains to the people how they are to offer their *firstfruits* to the Lord. Paul explores the connection between faith, its profession, and salvation and justification. After his baptism, Jesus spends 40 days in the desert where he encounters the devil and resists his temptations. One way Jesus prepared for his public ministry was to go into the desert, filled with the Holy Spirit, *to be tempted by the devil*. We may have to confront a similar experience during Lent: While striving to follow the inspirations of the Holy Spirit, we encounter temptations to abandon our good resolutions. Jesus' example shows us the disposition we must have if we are to triumph over the enemy.

We may give up meat or other desirable foods on Fridays during Lent, and especially on Good Friday, the day of Christ's saving death on the cross.

Our abstinence for Catholics 14 years and older (as long as there are no health issues) is another way of sharing in Christ's work of saving the world. We may also substitute other good actions for abstinence. These could include special acts of charity (visiting the sick or aged, helping those in any need, contributing to a work of charity) or other acts of piety (taking part in a service of worship with others, praying with our family, spending some extra time in personal prayer, especially with the scriptures).

GOOD SAMARITAN CORNER

Addressing the needs of people experiencing homelessness doesn't just mean providing food, essential items, and warm footwear. It also includes advocacy and education.

Here are some of the results from the Point-in-Time Count conducted in the District of Nipissing from October 9 to October 16, 2024.



- 531 people were identified as homeless
- 31 children under the age of 16 were homeless
- 81% were single and homeless
- 61% identified as male and homeless
- 48% identified as Indigenous and homeless
- 25% were in emergency shelters
