Death, Where is Your Sting?

Today we celebrate Christ's own victory over the grave. We hear the wonderful Easter message: "He is not here. He has risen!" Jesus has announced to the whole world that death has lost its power to hurt us. As Paul says: *Death has been swallowed up in victory.*



Where, O death, is your victory?

Where, O death, is your sting?

Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 15: 55, 57)

Jesus died in our place on the cross, taking on himself all our sin, all the sin that separates us from God – all the sin that prevents us from ever getting to heaven. Jesus rose again from the dead at Easter to demonstrate that death could not hold him down, that the power of sin to condemn us has been destroyed and the ability of death to wipe us out completely has been overcome.

This gives us positive hope – after our life on this earth is over, there is a new life waiting for us. Didn't Jesus say, "There are many rooms in my Father's house, and I am going to prepare a place for you"? (John 14:2).

The message of Easter is clear and simple. The enemy death has been defeated. And although we are parted from family and friends for a while because of death, we know that we shall meet up with those who die in the Lord beyond death in the bliss of eternal life. We may have longed for one more hour, or one more day, but in Christ we have eternity. When those close to us die, or when we die, we leave the troubles of this world and enter the joys of eternal life. When it comes to death our Christian faith is as relevant as ever.

- Who or what else can give us any security when faced with death?
- Who or what else can offer us any hope when death comes close?
- Who can make any sense out of what appears to us to be a senseless waste of life?
- Who can help us when someone is taken suddenly and inexplicably?
- Who else can comfort us when the pain that death brings strikes our hearts with such ferocity?
- Who? The living Jesus!

His resurrection assures us, who are his children, that we too shall rise.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!
