



Jesus sends out the seventy-two disciples in pairs ahead of himself "like lambs among wolves," without protection or even supplies, to proclaim that the Kingdom of God is near. This complete reliance on providence includes the possibility of both acceptance and rejection, and Jesus gives instructions on what the disciples should do in each situation. At the end of the reading, we hear that the missionary disciples come back rejoicing over their success. Jesus affirms the power that has been given to them but also reminds them to rejoice in what is most important: sharing in the Kingdom of God. As we gather today in worship, may our encounter with Christ change our hearts and strengthen us to be instruments of peace and mercy in our world.



Nothing Ordinary about "Ordinary Time"!

Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Even though the season of Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church, the fact that Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons reinforces this impression. Yet Ordinary Time is far from unimportant or uninteresting. **GREEN** is the liturgical color of Ordinary Time that we find on priestly vestments and in our church decor. It is the color of life and hope.

The numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. This is a time of conversion and quiet growth. It comprises the longest time on the liturgical calendar to consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and miracles while on this earth. And there's nothing "ordinary" about that!
