



In the first reading, the Apostles are filled with the Holy Spirit and begin speaking in different languages. Paul writes to the Corinthians that there is only one Spirit, but he bestows many spiritual gifts on the family of God. In the Gospel, Jesus comes to the disciples in the locked room, offers them peace, and breathes on them, saying, receive the Holy Spirit. The early Church was expanded when the resurrected Jesus left his disciples, promising to send the Holy Spirit to be with them on earth. Empowered by his presence among them, they began preaching the word even though they faced many challenges. The people listened and were baptized, and the Church was born.

Pentecost, derived from the Greek word "Pentēkostē," meaning fiftieth, occurs 50 days after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus, as described in the New Testament (Acts 2). This significant event not only empowers the early church but also represents the birth of Christianity as a global faith.

The empowerment of the apostles through the Holy Spirit symbolizes the strength and guidance available to believers. Consider how you can tap into this spiritual empowerment through prayer and community engagement.

One of the profound messages of Pentecost is the unity of the Christian community. The apostles, gathered from differing backgrounds, communicated in various languages, signifying the breaking of barriers. Acknowledging the Holy Spirit's presence in daily life can bring about profound changes. This powerful reminder invites individuals to seek guidance, wisdom, and inspiration in their personal journeys. Ask yourself:

- † Have I truly experienced the power of the Holy Spirit in my life?
- † Like the early disciples, do I recognize my need for the Spirit's presence and guidance?
- † Do I open myself daily to the renewing and sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit?
- † The Spirit fills our hearts with the love of God (Rom 5:5). Do I ask Him to fill me with that love?
- † Do I desire to live a holy life, knowing that the Holy Spirit is the giver of all holiness?





GOOD SAMARITAN CORNER

A Point in Time Count was conducted in the fall of 2024 throughout Nipissing District. Based on 304 completed surveys, the following key findings were captured:

- 32 % of respondents identified as having been in foster care or a group home
- 81% of respondents were single
- 10% were youth ages 16 to 24
- 24% were young adults ages 25 to 34
- 64% were adults ages 35 to 64
- 2% were seniors age 65 +
- 6% of respondents identified as being a former military or RCMP member
- 48% identified as Indigenous
- 44% first experienced homelessness before the age of 25!
