In the first reading, God issues a warning through Amos to complacent and self-serving Israelites. In the second reading, Paul charges Timothy to live up to his call as a man of God *until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ*. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man *received what was good* during his lifetime while ignoring Lazarus' suffering. In death, their situations are reversed. The word of God teaches us to pursue righteousness rather than selfishness. When we ourselves suffer, as Jesus did for us, we grow in humility and empathy toward others. We learn to re-evaluate our priorities and place love for God and our neighbor above pleasure, power, and wealth. Though not a good in itself, suffering can change our hearts, move us to repentance, and return us to God.

- ⇒ If you notice a person is hungry and you have your car care kit handy, a granola bar will help.
- ⇒ If you notice a person is cold, please consider buying them a hot beverage/food and/or providing them with clean warm socks.

Together, we can show the marginalized in North Bay how much we care.
