Our Parish Mission Statement:



The 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C reminds us to notice God's blessings. It calls us to give thanks for what He has done. The readings show healing, mercy, and the gift of faith. They help us see that faith grows stronger when we trust God and give Him praise.

Naaman is healed after listening to the prophet Elisha. He chooses to follow the God of Israel. In the Gospel, ten lepers are healed, but only one comes back to thank Jesus. This man, a Samaritan, shows true faith by giving thanks revealing a heart open to God's saving work.

Luke often highlights compassion, inclusion, and the call to discipleship. On this Sunday we are invited to be like him, praising God for His mercy and asking if if we thank God enough for His care and love.

Mass for the Bereaved & The Book of Life

Every year we traditionally celebrate All Souls Day - a way of remembering and celebrating the lives of all those who have died.

This year, our celebration will be held at the 11:00 am mass on Sunday, November 2.



Everyone is welcome to attend this mass and we extend a special invitation to those who have lost a loved one in the last year.

Each year at this time we also update "The Book of Life," our parish book that records the names of our deceased loved ones. The names of all those who have died from our parish during the past year (01 November 2024—30 October 2025) are recorded on the front page. For anyone who would like to update their page or add a page for their deceased loved ones, please contact the parish office for direction.

All through November, the books will be open on display in the sanctuary. If you have lost a loved one in the last year call the office or drop a note through the collection with the name of the deceased and your name and telephone number.

All names must be received by Wednesday, October 29.

November 30 at the 11 AM Mass, is the day that **Arthur Henry** will celebrate the Rite of **Admission to Candidacy** on his journey to become a Permanent Deacon.



This celebration offers the candidate the opportunity to publicly express their intention to receive ordination as a Deacon.

The term “deacon” means “servant,” and this resonates for Art, who together with his wife, Lisa, have been tremendous supporters of our parish for many years.

As a community, we are asked to accompany and pray for Art as he continues his catechetical instruction, and learns to deepen his faith, hope, love and compassion.

You are welcome to attend this Mass to show your support as he takes this next step on his journey to become a Deacon.
