The Fourth Sunday of Advent bring us very close to Christmas. The readings help us focus on who Jesus is and why He came. We hear the name Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." This is the message we hold onto as we get ready to celebrate his birth.

Each reading gives us something to think about. Isaiah speaks of a sign — a child born to a virgin. Paul reminds the early Christians that Jesus was promised long ago. The psalm talks about who come into God's presence. And in the Gospel, Joseph listens to God and chooses to stay with Mary.

These are not just stories from the past. They speak to us today. Like Joseph, we are asked to trust. Like Paul, we are called to share the good news. And like the people in Isaiah's time, we are told that God will not leave us alone.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent invites us to quiet our hearts. It tells us that Jesus is near. We wait with hope and joy, knowing that God is coming to be with us.

PRAYER

(Light the fourth candle on your Advent Wreath)

Father, all-powerful God, your eternal Word took flesh on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces his glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for his coming.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
