During the Octave (eight days) of Christmas we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The significance of the Feast unfolds when we come to understand the deeper truths it reveals. It teaches us about Jesus, Mary, and Joseph—and about each one of us and our own families.

Through our Baptism, we are invited to live our lives in Christ by living them in the Church - which is the Risen Body of Christ. The Church is the place where we learn, as the Apostle Paul reminded the

Colossian Christians, to "put on love, that is, the bond of perfection". (Col. 3:14) The Gospel of the Liturgy is taken from the presentation of Jesus in the temple account in St. Luke and the beautiful canticle of Zechariah. (Luke 2:22-40) However, upon leaving the temple to return to Nazareth, we read these words: "When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him."

The Holy Family is an icon of the domestic Church, which is called to pray together. The family is the first school of prayer where, from their infancy, children learn to perceive God thanks to the teaching and example of their parents.

The Incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, became one of us. He was born into a human family. That was neither accidental nor incidental. He teaches us how to live in His presence. In our life within the Christian family Jesus Christ is truly present. However, we need the eyes to see Him at work, the ears to hear His instruction and the hearts to make a place for Him to dwell.

Every moment of his time among us; from his conception, throughout His saving life, death and resurrection, Jesus was saving, redeeming, and re-creating the world. Making all things new. The Holy Family of Jesus, Joseph and Mary is not only our model, it is the beginning of the new family of the Church.

We are invited today to imitate the Holy Family. To learn to love, pray and grow in holiness. To forgive one another. To put on love, that is, the bond of perfection as shown to us by the first Christian Family.

**Loving God, let Mary's openness to your wondrous ways be an inspiration to place all trust you. Let Joseph's courage provide hope during times of anxiety and uncertainty. Let Jesus' life ignite all families with a spirit of light and love.**

**May the grace that encircled the Holy Family widen to embrace all families. For this we pray, Amen.**


